

is pleased to announce the formation of a new lineage organization to accompany "First Families of Ohio."

(The Society of Civil War Families of Ohio)

The purpose of this lineage society is to honor participants in the Civil War, to recognize their descendants and collateral relatives, and to develop a unique collection of family-oriented materials relating to this period of American history.

collection of family-oriented materials relating to this period of American history.

Any member of The Ohio Genealogical Society who can prove they are a direct descendant, or collateral relative, of any person who served in the Civil War is eligible to become a member of The SOCIETY of CIVIL WAR FAMILIES of OHIO. Both Union and Confederate service, whether male or female, is acceptable with the necessary documentation. The participant must have lived or served in Ohio or died here. Service is not limited to an Ohio outfit. Those who served as 'Squirrel Hunters' or 'Spies' are also eligible.

You must submit an application and the documents that will prove the relationship. There must be documentation for each generation, including yours. your parents, grandparents, etc. The application fee is \$30.00. Your application, and it's accompanying documentation, must first be approved by The SOCIETY of CIVIL WAR FAMILIES of OHIO State Committee and finally by The Ohio

Genealogical Society's Board of Trustees.

The dates of service must fall between 12 April 1861 (the bombardment of Fort Sumter) and 18 April 1865 (when Joseph E. Johnston (C.S.A.) surrendered to General William T. Sherman at Durham Station, North Carolina).

Charter members of this society will be installed at a dinner, to be held Friday evening April 18, 1997, during the annual OGS Conference in Independence (near Cleveland), Ohio. You will receive a certificate suitable for framing and a medal. If you are unable to attend the installation, your medal and certificate will be mailed to you following the 1997 conference.






