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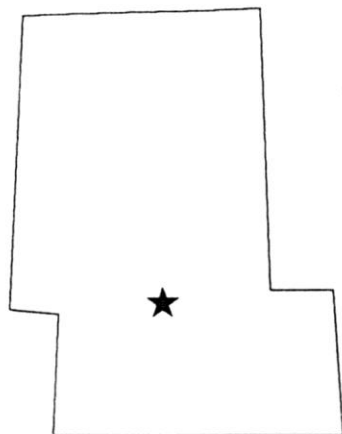

NEW QUERY / RESEARCH POLICY

QUERY - a request for information which is only published in our newsletter (UNION ECHOES). This is so readers are aware of the request and can contact the writer of the query to partly answer it with information on hand

Unlimited queries are published at no charge to members, but non-members are limited to query at no charge.

RESEARCH - a request for information which involves looking into various records and indexes in various locations. Research services are provided only by chapter volunteers and only upon receipt of the following:

1. Ten Dollar (check payable to Union County Chapter, OGS) - processing prior to actual research.
2. SASE (Self Addressed, Stamped, Business Size Envelope) or sufficient postage for return mailing.
3. Specific questions - keep questions as short as possible (preferably limit them to 3 x 5 cards).

Below is the complete text of the Preliminary Research Request Procedures to be published in both the Union Echoes and Bylaws!

PRELIMINARY RESEARCH REQUEST PROCEDURES

1. Letter is received from person making request.
2. Request Coordinator checks his computer for any prior requests.
3. Requests (with list of any prior requests) are handed out at meeting.
4. Searchers taking requests to answer, will send the person making the request a form which will contain the estimated cost (both for volunteer's time and expenses) of answering the request as well as a copy of the NEW QUERY/RESEARCH POLICY and cover letter.
5. Upon receipt of the estimated cost, the actual request will be answered.

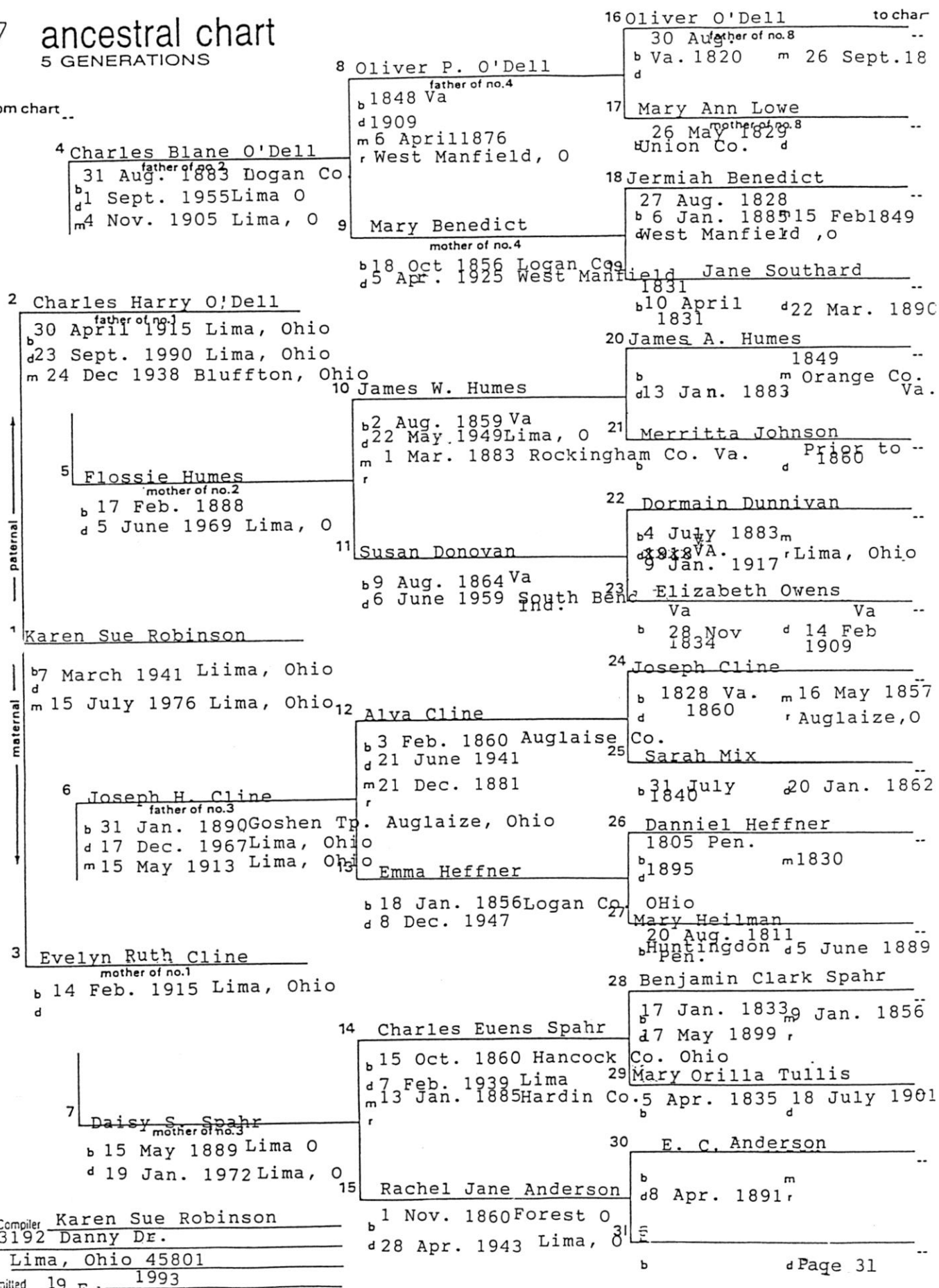

Monroe; Clerk, Eli Gavriel. In 1856, they erected their present church edifice. It is a good Pram building, 30 X 40 feet, with a vestibule in front, 8 X 20 feet; making the entire length 48

feet. Entire cost; about \$1,600. (Excerpt from History of Union County, Ohio, 1883, Beers, Reprint 1981, Vol. 2, page 188.)

THE COWGILL CONNECTIONS OF UNION COUNTY, OHIO\*  
by Mrs Max [Marian] Cowgill

The 1820 census of Delaware County, Radnor Twp, page 119A shows the following families: Alexander Cowgill, George Crow, and James Irwin - living side by side. A deed recorded in Delaware County, on 16 Jan 1827, to Alexander Cowgill, lists the property as VM3696. The sale of this same property, in 1835, is recorded as VM3696 in Union County. The property in question was located in the eastern quarter of Virginia Military Lands #3696 and contained 127 1/2 acres in or near the present location of the village of Magnetic Springs.

Alexander Cowgill was born 9 Feb 1784 in Frederick County, Virginia, the eighth child of Elisha and Martha (Ewing) Cowgill. When Alexander was about ten years old, his parents moved into Hampshire County, VA, but only for a short while. Apparently, the call of the West was heard by several of the neighbors as a large group of pioneers, including the Cowgills, prepared for yet another journey. Their oldest son and oldest daughter, both of whom were married, remained in Virginia. The Hampshire County property was sold and a deed was recorded to Elisha Cowgill in Mason County, KY, on 3 May 1796. Elisha stayed in the area of Maysville, KY, until 15 Aug 1800 when he sold his property and migrated up the Scioto River to the area north of Chillicothe, Ohio. One of his married sons had preceded him to this area where his first child was born in 1799.

Elisha did not buy property or pay taxes in Ohio. According to an entry in Alexander Cowgill's bible, Elisha Cowgill died 23 Oct 1804. No proof of burial site has been found. Elisha Cowgill was born to a Quaker family - his grandfather was one of the many English people who came to America on the first trip of William Penn with 23 boatloads of immigrants fleeing the church tyranny of their homeland. The widow, Ellen (Stackhouse) Cowgill, and her five children, arrived in America in 1682. Her husband, Ralph, is thought to have died in prison for his religious beliefs.

The History of Ross Co., Ohio, relates: "Col. Isaac Dawson was a Justice of the Peace in town (Chillicothe) as early as 1804. In January (12th) of that year, he married Alexander Cowgill and Mary Crow." Mary Crow was born in Virginia the daughter of George and Margaret Crow. She had a brother named Jacob Anderson Crow and a sister named Hester Ann Crow. Jacob Crow married Nancy Miller on 26 Feb 1811 and Jacob died 1 Apr 1813. Possibly, both he and Nancy died of some disease as his parents, George & Margaret Crow, raised a grandchild, Margaret E. Crow, born about 1812. Hester Ann Crow married James Irwin and they accompanied her parents and the Alexander Cowgill family (her sister) to the Delaware/Union area. By 1828, the George Crow family and the James Irwin family had moved to Pleasant Twp., Marion County, where they remained.

On 16 Mar 1812, Alexander volunteered as a private in Captain James Menary's Company of Ohio Rangers. He was discharged 16 Mar 1813 at Fort St. Marys, Ohio. By then, Alexander & Mary were the parents of two daughters and a son. Their first son had died at age 15 months in 1810. Six more daughters would be born to the couple but no other sons.

The question of where Alexander was located between 1813 and the time when the families migrated north was answered, to some degree, by an ad found in the Chillicothe newspaper, The Supporter, on Wednesday, August 5, 1818. It reads: "Springfield Township, Ross County. Taken up by Alexander Cowgill, a horse of a light grey colour, about 15 hands high, supposed to 13 or 14 years old, shod all round, some what fly-bit on the shoulders and forward - no other marks or any brand perceivable. Appraised at 45 dollars, by Jacob Hough and Joseph Gandy. A true copy, Wm. Johnston, J.P.

July 20." This "jewel" limits the time of migration from Aug 1818 to sometime in 1819. A daughter was born 22 Apr 1820 - most likely in the place, as mentioned, where they were enumerated that year.

We wonder if that grey horse helped bring the family north? Another ad in The Supporter on May 12, 1813, in part: "All persons indebted to the estate of Jacob Anderson Crow, deceased, late of

Springfield Twp., Ross County ..... George Crow, Administrator."

Springfield Twp. lies just north and east of Chillicothe. George & Jacob Crow had bought their property as co-owners, in 1806, so it is likely that the married Crow daughters also lived on the same property.

In the History of Ross & Highland Counties: "Alexander Cowgill carried salt for the Scioto Salt Works." Census records show Alexander's occupation as: 1820, engaged in manufacture in Radnor Twp., Delaware Co.; 1830, lived in Leesburg Twp., Union Co.; 1840, farmer in Claibourne Twp.; 1850, an asher in Claibourne Twp. (an operation in which timber was burned for the potash contained in the ashes); 1860, farmer, Claibourne Twp.

Alexander's final move was to the area between Bigelow's Corner at the north junction of SR4 & SR47, to the Claibourne Cemetery on the south side of the road and bordering the Creek. The deed for the Claibourne property was recorded at the same time as the transfer of the Leesburg property was finalized. The Leesburg property was sold to one person but then sold to another with permission from Alexander Cowgill so that may have been a delayed transaction; nevertheless, both were recorded in 1835.

In 1835, Alexander's only son, George Watson Cowgill, married Susan Smart. He purchased one-half of his fathers property plus land on the north side of the road. George made his home on the north side of the road until 1876 when he moved his family to Jackson Twp. At least three of George's sisters lived in the same general area north of the present road. Two of the younger sisters and George deeded 1/2 acre at Bigelow's Corner to the Board of Education, in 1868, and many people still live today who attended that school.

"Mary W. Cowgill departed this life, at 3:00 o'clock a.m., May 7, 1865 76 years, 8 months, 1 day." "Alexander Cowgill departed this life August 21st 1865 at 11 o'clock and 15 minutes p.m. Aged 81 6 months and 12 days." They are buried in the old section of the Claibourne Cemetery and their stones are still

upright and legible. They were the parents of the following children:

## The Methodist Episcopal Church

The organization of this society in Marysville occurred probably in 1827. George Snodgrass, in writing of the early affairs of the place, says: "We were in the bounds of London Circuit at that time. Two preachers were on the circuit, one by the name of Samuel P. Shaw, preacher in charge, the other by the name of John C. Havens. They offered to form a class or church if we could raise seven members, and we set out to raise that number. George Minturn and lady, Miss Hannah Fox (sister of Mrs. Minturn, who afterward became my wife), Newton Hicks and lady. and myself, made six members. Silas G. Strong, a Presbyterian, gave us his name, making the seven members. We were organized in George Minturn's house, perhaps 18x20, and had preaching there until we could build a church. George Minturn was the Class Leader."

Mr. Shaw's home was about six miles east of London, Madison County, and he was the pioneer Methodist preacher of this vicinity. His circuit extended from near Columbus to about forty miles west, taking in an area so large that it required four weeks to make the tour around the circuit. One appointment was at Amrine's, one and a half miles northwest of Marysville.

Beginning with 1841, the following have been ministers of this church and the Presiding Elders of the district: 1841--Zachariah Connell, P. E. , James Parcels, Joseph W. Smith, pastors of Marysville Circuit; 1842--Wesley Webster, pastor; 1843--William Simmons, P. E., and John W. Young and Thomas Hurd, pastors; 1844--C. B. Warrington and Ebenezer Chase, pastors; 1845-46--Wesley Webster and T. M. Gossard, pastors; 1847--James L. Grover, P. E., and P. F. Holtzinger and M. Coffman, pastors; 1849--J. W. Clark, P. E., and David Sharp and James Gilruth, pastors; 1850--S. C. Riker, pastor; 1851--H. Brooks, P. E.; Ebenezer Chase and Samuel M. Merrill (now Bishop Merrill), pastors; 1853--Uriah Heath, P. E.; T. D. In 1853, a lot formerly occupied by Felix G. Wingfield with a cooper-shop was purchased for church purposes, and a building fitted up. It was burned September 25, 1863, being at the time used for a hay press by Woods & Dolbear. It was a frame structure. The present brick church owned by the society was dedicated in 1856, and stands on East Center Street. During 1882, over \$2,000 were expended upon it in repairs upon its interior. The site is the one purchased in 1853. A parsonage was built in the summer of 1871, on ground now included in the new court house lots. The property was sold to the county, and the present parsonage was purchased by the trustees of the church in 1880; it was formerly the residence of J. B. Whelpley, and is located on South East Street. The church in December, 1882, had a membership of about 240, and the Sunday school had 170 members; Prof. L. B. Demorest, Superintendent. It also has a library of about 500 volumes.
