## COUNTY HEALTH RECORDS

PAM CARPENTER, Vital Statistics Registrar of Union Co. Health Department was our guest speaker at the November meeting, and gave a comprehensive outline of the records that are in her jurisdiction that are of interest to genealogists. The Union Co. Health Dept. is located at 621 S. Plum St., Marysville, OH. 43040, Phone (937) 642-0801, or 1-800-333-9461.

To order a birth record by mail, you need: 1) Person's name (maiden name) 2) Date of birth, 3) Father's name, 4) Mother's maiden name, 5) Check or money order for cost of records, and 6) the address to send certificate to.

To order death records by mail, you need to supply: 1) Name, 2) date of death, at least month and year, 3) check or m.o. for proper amount, and 4) your address.

To request certificates from the Ohio Department of Health, please send your request to:

Cost from Ohio Dept. Is \$7 for Certified Copy, and \$1.10 for uncertified. Make check or m. o. payable to "State Treasury".

Cost from Union O. is the same for certified copy, or \$.25 for uncertified copy.

The Department of Health will be happy to assist you in your search for your family genealogy. All they need are the persons' names and approximate dates of birth or death. They will search their files and allow you to view the documents related to your request. While all death records are open for review, birth records are limited due to the confidential information they contain.

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## OLD TIME SURVEYING

To acquire land in Kentucky, a settler had to secure a warrant from Virginia, which governed it as a territory. Veterans were entitled to 200-500 free acres. All others had to pay from \$1 to \$8 per acre. The survey crew went into the wilderness and marked off the acreage. The surveyor travelled with two "chainmen" to measure distances, a "landmarker" to slash blazes on trees, and a "spy" to hunt for food and to look out for Indians. The surveyor or "pilot" took compass bearings from easily recognizable landmarks and jotted down distances in 16 1/2 foot "poles." He then converted poles to acres at 40 poles per acre. Then he

registered each claim and made plats (maps) of the land showing property lines. The Virginia warrant system put a premium on knowing the lay of the land.

The direction of the boundary lines were made with a compass. After peering at the landmark through the sights of the compass, the surveyor noted the bearing by reading the needle on the compass. The "Jacob's staff" replaced the bulky tripod in getting level compass readings. The surveyor drove the staff into the ground, then balanced the compass on the ball and socket mounting of the staff. ### **100F MEMORIAL SERVICES**

The services were held as near the anniersary day of the death of Thomas Wiley, as was most convenient. The organizer, Mr. Wildey was born in London.1-15-1782 and emigrated to America in 1817, landing in Baltimore. Here he organized Washington Lodge No. 1 in 1819. Mr. Wildey died 1020-1861.

## WASHINGTON TWP., UNION CO.

Davis Methodist Protestant Chapel is located on the Essex and Rush Creek Road, in the eastern part of the township. The society was organized in 1848 with ten members—Jonathan Fields and wife, Ebenezer Davis and wife, Thomas Miller and wife, Jesse Weatherbee and wife, and Jefferson Field and wife—by the Rev. Cyrus Carter in a log schoolhouse which stood on Lemuel Titsworth's land. The services were held in this schoolhouse for ten or twelve years, when the neat frame church now used as the house of worship was constructed. Ebenezer Davis, Thomas Miller and John McPeck were the largest contributors in the enterprise. The first mentioned donated the lot upon which the house was erected. Rev. Oliver Stephens was the pastor in charge when it was built. The church has been prosperous and now contains fifty-seven members. Rev. James Adams has perhaps been the most successful pastor. During the revival services conducted by him, the membership of the church increased to considerably more than one hundred. This church has been a charge in the Richwood Circuit until about a year ago, when it and the Essex church engages the services of Rev. Cadwallader, who has since administered to them. A Sabbath school is regularly maintained during pleasant weather. (History of Union County, 1883, Beers reprint)

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BIBLE RECORDS: The Donohoe Bible was borrowed for copying from an elderly widow, who is the neighbor or Mary Seslar, member and presently secretary of our chapter. This widow is one of the children named among births, but because of age does not wish to be listed for contact. The front cover of the volume is missing but title

page survived. The eight Family Record pages have ornate borders and had been bound in the front part of the volume. The spelling and punctuation used in typescript were copied as faithfully as Mary could manage of the handwritten material. The question marks indicate areas where overwriting could be read different ways, or where words were missing because of frayed edges of page.

## THE NEW M. E. CHURCH AT BROADWAY DEDICATED ON SUNDAY LAST

Last Sunday was a big day in Broadway and the little village, which lies a few miles west of Richwood on the N. Y. P. & O. Railroad, was full of strangers. The occasion which attracted so many nonresidents was the dedication of the new Methodist Episcopal church at that place.

The new building is a wooden structure with seating capacity of 400, and for beauty of architecture, fineness of finish and furnishings it is one of the best in Union county, and the people of Broadway may well be proud of it. Shearer & Sons, of Marysville, were the builders and the beautiful edifice stands as a monument of praise, speaking volumes in their behalf as master builders. Broadway now becomes the head of the circuit and great credit is due Rev. Hemphill and his estimable wife for the untiring energy, devotion and zeal to the new enterprise and they were wisely returned to this people by the conference for another year.

For years the M. E. Society have been worshiping in the F. W. Baptist church, which has been used by different christian denominations when not occupied by the organization which bears its name. The little band of Methodists which have existed in that community, dates back as far as 1854, when the first class was organized, composed of P. Safford and wife, Thos. E. Lockwood and wife, Hiram Danforth and wife, Mrs. Hannah Temple, Z. C. Pooler and perhaps others whose names have been forgotten by the residents of the community at present. Broadway was then situated one mile east of the present site but consisted of only a few very modern dwellings. The organization was supplied with preaching for a few years by Rev. Johnson, Rev. Webster and Rev. Southard, from which time they had regular pastors as follows: Revs. Good, Lawrence, Mounts, DeLiel, Mathers, Bethard, Schultz, DeKalb, Powell, Carter, Jaggars and Parlette. Their meetings were held in a rude building on lands donated by J. Freeman and Joseph Maskell for that purpose. After the pastorate of Rev. Parlette, the organization was considerably diminished by deaths and removals and finally was disbanded until about two years ago, when, through the efforts of Presiding Elder L. M. Albright, Rev. Hemphill, who then resided near Goshen, Ind., was induced to come to Broadway.

Soon after Rev. Hemphill took up his residence in Broadway the building of a new church was proposed and the lot upon which the building stands was purchased May 29, 1891, by the Ladies' M. E. Home Society and deeded it to the church June 14, 1893. This society was organized in 1890 and has been working very hard since that time to secure funds to furnish a church when built. Since their organization they have donated over \$400 in cash besides the lot and the specifications. By their assistance the male members were greatly encouraged and what was often said to be an impossibility was accomplished in the end, and they now have a pleasant place in which they may worship their Master.

Hundreds of people from the different parts of the circuit, which consists of Broadway, Asbury, Newton, Pottersburg and Buck Run, as well as adjoining circuits, were present at the dedicatory services last Sunday morning. Presiding Elder L. M. Albright was present and selected for his text the 18 verse of the 16 chapter of Matthew: "On this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." He talked to the audience in his usual impressive manner about forty minutes, after which he stated that the indebtedness of the society was a little over \$300 and that he desired to raise that amount before the dedicatory services took place. To secure the required amount was the work of but a few minutes and when the cash and amounts subscribed were counted out it was found they had obtained \$532.28, after which Presiding Elder Albright and Rev. Hemphill performed the dedicatory services.

One year ago the membership of this class was few in number but today we find there is over ninety in good standing, as follows:
